### NEW STUDENT ENROLLMENT PROCESS

Students start with the required Registration & Engagement Course. These occur every other month. Students can sign up on our website by clicking on the "Get Started" box and choosing "learn or improve English." Registration is one day for two hours. Engagement Course is two days for two hours each day.

### GENERAL ESOL

Our general ESOL classes cover most levels. We offer both in-person and virtual classes at this time depending on level and schedule. In general, we offer these class times for these levels (0 pre-lit - 6 high):

- AM: Levels 1-3, 2-4, 4-6, multi
- PM: Levels pre-lit, 1-3, 4-6, multi(late class)
- Afternoon: Levels 2-4, multi

### ADDITIONAL CLASSES:

- English for Hospitality Purposes (Jan.)
- Academic English (Apr.)
- Business English (July)
- Healthcare English (Oct.)
- Civics (year-round)
- GED/ESOL (year-round)

### DISTANCE EDUCATION

Our distance education program offers students the freedom to learn English on their time. This teacher-supported computer program works on almost any device. In addition, targeted language lessons are assigned to students as needed. Students are required to work a minimum of five hours a week.

### ATTENDANCE POLICY

Being in class is vital to the learning process. As an education program we hold our students to a 75% attendance policy. We do, however, understand that events happen, so our students have a number of ways to make up time that they miss from their class.
