In order to meet the literacy needs of Summit County residents, Project Learn provides comprehensive reading, writing, math, Pre-GED® and GED® preparation classes to more than 1,000 adults each year at no cost to the individual. Our courses are designed to develop critical learning skills and increase confidence. These classes, which also include college transition and workforce development courses, help the student prepare for the GED® test and beyond.

By focusing on conversational English, as well as reading, writing and listening skills, students are also more prepared to take and pass the U.S. Citizenship Test, for which we also offer specific study classes. ESOL courses are offered at the beginning, intermediate and advanced levels, all emphasizing fluency and accuracy in spoken and written English. In addition to our core classes, we also offer specialized courses in pronunciation and conversation. Thanks to our commitment to small class sizes, students receive ample individual attention and participation opportunities.

The goal of college and career readiness is to facilitate student success through partnerships with post-secondary and workforce development providers. The outcome of this program is to engage and maintain formal partnerships with post-secondary/workforce development partners by creating relationships that benefit our students and aide in the bridging of skills between education and career advancement. We currently have partnerships with ConxusNEO, Ohio Means Jobs, Stark State, Summa Health, and the University of Akron.

Students must be at least 16 years old to enroll and complete an orientation prior to class placement. First time GED® test takers are eligible for an \$80 voucher. The cost to retake the test is \$10 per section. Students are able to take the test one subject section at a time. The sections are math, science, social studies, and reasoning through the language arts.
