

You will work directly with Orienatation staff, your Student Coach, and of course, your instructor.



AT BAT TO FIRST

Some want it to happen. Some wish it to happen. Others make it happen.

In Orientation, you will complete any required paperwork and check your knowledge in Reading and Math This "Knowledge Check" will be used to determine next steps. For most students, six weeks of classes with dedication to attendance and participation is the right move forward. Your Orientation facilitator and Student Coach are prepared to help you determine your educational goal and the best way to get there. At the end of the six weeks, you will check your knowledge again to see where you have made educational gains, and to identify where there is still room for improvement.



FIRST BASE

Opportunity may knock, but you must open the door.

You have made it "on base"! You will join class at the start of the Welcome Week. During this first week, you will continue to develop learning goals and get familiar with the classroom, classmates, and instructor.





RUN TO SECOND

You have made it "on base" and now the real work begins. Attendance and participation are the keys to success. Keep your head in the game and attend every class to get the most out of your efforts. Project Learn strictly enforces a 75% attendance policy. We are here for those that are in it to win it. We also know that life can throw a curve ball. Now that you have two "Knowledge Checks", one from Orientation and one after forty hours of class participation, you are able to measure your gains. You will look closely at your outcomes to identify areas of growth and areas that still need improvement. Your "Knowledge Check" may indicate that you are ready for an Official Practice Test, or specialty course. If that is the case, the Student Engagement Coordinator and/or the ESOL Coordinator will work with you to determine what supplemental services will be a good fit. If you don't see the gains you expected on your "Knowledge Check", you will work with your instructor and/or your Student Coach to identify ways to make your classtime and study habits more effective.



RUN HOME

Do the best you can until you know better: Then when you know better, do better:

This is the final stretch, and you are so close to a home run! It's just a matter of keeping your momentum and implementing any new strategies you discovered. You are so close to your original goal, it's natural to start thinking about what you want to accomplish next.
